





 - Reach out and speak to someone you trust and do not be afraid to ask for help when you feel you need it. People are often far more understanding than we think they will be.
 - Break down challenging situations into smaller parts and work on feeling more relaxed with each part rather than thinking of the whole challenge as one.
 - Try to focus on what people are saying rather than assuming the worst or worrying about what they might be thinking about you.
